

# WOMEN'S T20 WORLD CUP India ease past Windies for second win

## Deepti gets 100th wicket in T20Is

Cape Town, Feb 16: Harmanpreet Kaur and Richa Ghosh combined for a decisive partnership worth 73 runs to put India within touching distance of victory, while spinner Deepti Sharma made history in the game by taking 3/15 and becoming the first Indian to reach 100 wickets in T20 internationals. India had earlier beaten Pakistan in their first match of the tournament.

And on a tough afternoon for West Indies, they suffered both a defeat and potentially the loss of two key players, with Stafanie Taylor taken from the field on a stretcher and captain Hayley Matthews also appearing to pick up an injury.

A lightning-fast start, inspired by the aggression of Shafali Verma, saw India rack up 41/2 in the Powerplay, putting them in control of a chase of 119.

Smriti Mandhana was the first wicket to fall, stumped off the bowling of Karishma Ramharack, and Jemimah Rodrigues joined



her back in the pavilion after being sharply caught and bowled by Hayley Matthews

Verma's onslaught came to an abrupt end when she was caught for 28 from 23 balls, leaving captain Kaur and Ghosh out in the middle with work still to do. And the game was paused for a lengthy and concerning treatment for West Indies veteran Stafanie Taylor, who appeared to suffer a recurrence of a back injury in the field.

The delay broke the flow of the West Indies bowlers, with the

momentum swinging decisively in India's favour upon the restart.

A classy partnership between Kaur (33 from 42) and Ghosh (44\* from 32) helped India ease to victory with time to spare, and West Indies suffered another blow late in the match when captain Matthews also appeared to pick up an injury - leaving West Indies facing the prospect of playing their remaining Group 2 matches without both of their star openers.

Earlier, India's bowling attack, inspired by the record-making Sharma,

curtailed West Indies after a strong second-wicket partnership had threatened to set up a big first-innings score at Newlands.

There is only ever one first, and Deepti Sharma will now always be the first Indian to reach 100 wickets in T20 internationals.

The 25-year-old all-rounder has made quite an impact in the international game with her off-breaks and has reached the century of wickets in 89 T20I appearances for her country.

# Delhi dash Services win hopes with late goal

Bhubaneswar, Feb 16: An injury-time equaliser by Delhi left the battle for Riyadh open in Group B with Services made to wait to earn their spot in the semifinals.

Manipur meanwhile shrugged off their loss to Meghalaya and won big to keep their hopes to make the knockouts of the 76th National Football Championships for the Santosh Trophy strong

and alive.

Manipur stung by the defeat to Meghalaya in their previous game ran rampant against a hapless Bengal side at the Kalinga Stadium in the evening kick-off. The loss means Bengal are now knocked out of the competition, with two games yet to play.

Manipur's architect in chief was Subash Singh, who rolled back

the year in a scintillating performance right from the start.

Singh had a part to play in each of Manipur's goals, his pass sending Naoba Meitei into space on the right in the first half, from which the youngster finished brilliantly, shooting into the far corner, from an acute angle. For Bengal, the pain soon got worse.

Bengal came out with

a bit more energy in the second half, utilising their wings, and doing damage from crosses from both sides. Within nine minutes of the restart they had their reward, Souvik Kar heading it in to halve the deficit.

Services coach MG Ramachandran had cautioned his team against taking things easily after winning their two opening encounters, saying that it was a group of equals, and on the day he was proven right.

A win would have seen Services become the first team through to the knockout stages, for the better part of 92 minutes they looked like doing so.

Having started off stronger and with more purpose, Services took the lead in the 21st minute via a Christopher Kamei penalty. Kamei, who had sparked the comeback against Bengal, with a brilliant free kick equaliser, was the architect of everything Services did right in the game.

# Sriram, Jeevan enter Chennai ATP challenger last 8

Chennai, Feb 16: Top-seeded Indian duo of Sriram Balaji and Jeevan Nedunchezhiyan advanced to the quarterfinals of the Chennai Open ATP Challenger on Wednesday with a straight set win over Frederico Ferreira Silva/Nicolas Moreno De Alboran.

The Indian pair won 6-4, 7-5 to set up an all-Indian quarterfinal showdown against wild cards Sumit Nagal/Sasikumar Mukund, who defeated Yu Hsiou Hsu/Christopher Rungkat 7-6,

2-1 (retired) in another first round encounter.

Another Indian, Arjun Kadhe, also reached the quarterfinals as he and British partner Jay Clarke defeated Dayne Kelly/Dane Sweeny 3-6, 6-3, 10-7. There was a huge upset in the singles as American Nicolas Moreno de Alboran upset top seed Chun-hsin Tseng 6-2, 6-4 to advance to the quarters.

De Alboran will take on Yasutaka Uchiyama for a spot in the semi-finals as the Japanese player upset the seventh

seed Dalibor Svrčina 6-1, 6-7, 6-4. France's Arthur Cazaux and Australia's Dane Sweeny also won their second round singles matches.
